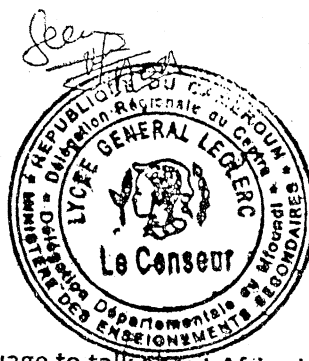

A couple of years ago, a lady, Miss A offered a friend Miss B a bottle of beer. Miss B had just bought three capsules of flagyl which she swallowed down with beer .Hours later at home she started vomiting. Suspecting that she had been poisoned, she told her relatives what had happened before being rushed to the hospital.

At the hospital, the doctor explained that it was a mixture of beer and flagyl that caused the vomiting. An antidote was prescribed and Miss B was taken home. Her jubilant relatives had just Miss A's house were they had given good beating and had smashed her property. Only to be told that the vomiting was caused by her mixture of beer and flagyl. A long lasting friendship was thus ruined simply because of ignorance situation like that happen very often on drugs that have been banned by the government still fine their way into the country. It is thus very dangerous to swallow drugs that have not been prescribed by a competent health worker or drugs specialist. Street hawkers sell mostly pirate drugs fake drugs are common. Between the pharmacist and the illegal operators it is not just a capitalist dual of sales and profit; it is a matter of right and wrong. The serious consequences of this kind of drug abuse should never be taken lightly.
