In Cameroon nowadays societies, juvenile delinquency is a serious problem., for example, the CRTV reports that during the mid 1990s about two-fifths of all arrests for burglary and arsons were of people

under 18. Four percent of children aged 10 -18 appeared in a juvenile to court. About 30 percent of

boys living in slum areas appeared in a juvenile court at least once. Girls were becoming more involved in crime, and one of every youngsters appearing in juvenile court was a girl. Causes of delinquency.

The first major cause of the delinquency seems to focus on family relationships, especially those between parents and individual children. Many studies have shown that if children have had an unhappy home, and if they have felt discontented with their circumstances and environment. Then delinquency has appeared to them to be a solution. If children do not get along with their parents or if the patterns of discipline and punishment are inconsistent, then delinquency seems to bring the attention and approval they crave.
