What are Human Rights?

Human rights are commonly understood as being those rights which are natural to human beings. The concept of human rights acknowledges that every single human being is entitled to enjoy his or her human rights without distinction as a race, colour, sex, language, religion, political or other opinion, natural or social origin, property, birth and other status.

Human rights are legally guaranteed by human rights and laws protecting individuals and groups against actions that interfere with fundamental freedoms and human dignity. They are expressed in treaties, customary international law, bodies of principles and other sources of law. Human rights law places an obligation on states to act in a particular way and prohibits states from engaging in specified activities. However, the law does not establish human rights. Human rights are inherent entitlements which come to every person as a consequence of human being. Human rights are founded on respect for the dignity and worth of each person. They are universal, meaning that they are applied equally and without discrimination to all people. No one can have his or her own rights taken away and it is insufficient to respect some human rights and not others. All human rights should therefore be seen as having equal importance and of being equally essential to respect for the dignity of every person.
