Traditional Dance in Cameroon

Dance in Cameroon is an important part of the tradition, region, and socialization of the people. Before independence, the colonial authorities and Christian missionaries discouraged native dances because they believed it to be a threat to their security. After independence however, the government recognized traditional dance as part of the Cameroon's culture and tried to preserve it. Cameroon can be categorized into traditional dances, and popular dances. The traditional dances follow strict choreography and, the dancers are segregated based. The occupation, sex, social status and factors.

Most traditional dances require props such as masks, fans, guns, or whips. On the other hand, popular dances involve both men and women partying in a club, dancing to makossa, bikutsi, hip-hop and others.

Traditional dance is performed mostly in ceremonies and rituals, such as births, wedding, and funerals. Some invoke the spirits of ancestors to cure those who are sick. For example, the Bamileke perform war dances, and the *Motio* of the Southwest incorporates the slaying of a goat with a single blow to demonstrate the dancers' powers. The Baka dance, the *luna*, is to celebrate a successful hunt. Among some groups, dancers work themselves into a trance and communicate with the spirit world. For example, members of the *Ntsham* society of the Kaka people in Cameroon's Northwest Region dance to bring about spiritual possession.
