Don't smoke!

Every year nearly 10 000 adults die in Cameroon as a result of exposure to smoke and tobacco products. Why do people smoke, knowing that it will domage heir health and might even kill them? More men than woman smoke. One study says 14% of men use tobacco, compared to 4% of women. Other studies claim these percentages are much higher. Worryingly, researchers have found that increasing numbers of youths under the age of 15 use tobacco: 13.8% of boys and 57% of of girls.

Smoking does not only harm the users. Second hand smoke has harmful effects, causing breathing problems. 42% of youth are exposed to second hand smoke in public places and 29% are exposed at home. Cameroon does not allow smoking in public places such as schools and hospitals to prevent harm from second-hand smoke.

Smoking culture

Tobacco use is a problem that the world has been dealing with for generations and it simply refuses to go away. Over the years, tobacco has been used in go away. Over the years, tobacco has been used in different forms around the world. Cigarettes are the most common form, available all over the world. Besidestoigarettes, there are also cigars, pipes and water pipes

known as hookahs. The pipe is the oldest method of smoking tobacco. Young people negative effects are the same or even worse. Smoking a hookah exposes smokers to toxic chemicals that are not filtered out by the water. The smoke also contains more carbon monoxide than cigarette smoke and exposes those close by to more second- hand smoke.

Prevention methods

Many countries around the world have started printing graphic images cigarette packets to show the negative effects of smoking such as rotten teeth and tar-filled hunge. However, people who are addicted to cigarettes seem to ignore these images and continue to smoke. Giving up smoking reduces the risk of smoke – related disease such as hunger cancer, bronchitis, emphysema, heart attacks and poor blood circulation which could lead to amputation. However, it would be best to never start smoking at all.
