Answer: The Sawa people of Cameroon celebrate this festival.

#### 4. Name three things that happen during the festival.

Answer: A Miss Ngondo Beauty Competition, a canoe race, and the Jengu Ceremony.

#### 5. What does Miss Ngondo do?

Answer: Miss Ngondo dresses up in the traditional Kaba of the Sawa Ladies, wears a fancy hat, smiles beautifully, and dances to the music of her people as she parades with the chiefs and dignitaries.

### 6. What does she wear?

Answer: She wears the traditional Kaba of the Sawa Ladies, a fancy hat, and smiles beautifully.

#### 7. What do you think makes the canoe race so exciting to watch?

Answer: The canoe race is exciting because the villagers decorate their boats brightly, row rhythmically and in unison, and the first boat to reach the ceremonial point wins a cash prize.

### 8. What is the main attraction of the Ngondo?

Answer: The main attraction of the Ngondo is the Jengu ceremony.

### 9. List two things that happen on the Wouri River.

Answer: A member of the Jengu Cult dives into the water to visit the underwater kingdom of the Miengu, and he gives a sacred vase containing a message from the ancestors to the chiefs.
