

Some countries combine the different systems to suit their own specific needs. Monarchies, emirates and sultanates are ruled by kings, queens, emirs or sultans. These leaders inherit their power to rule over a country. They are not elected by the people of the country.

In a dictatorship, a country is ruled by a one person or group of people who controlled everything. Dictators are also not elected. They take power through force. In a republic or a federation, the citizens elect representatives to make and enforce laws. Republics and federations are therefore democratic form of government. Most governments around the world today are based on democratic principles.

A democracy is a system of government in which all the people of a country can vote to elect their representatives. It is also defined as the government of the people, for the people, by the people. Democracy helps to ensure the fair and equal treatment of all citizens of a country and ensure their right to take part in making decisions. Free and fair elections are held on a regular basis to choose and replace governments. In democracy, the laws are applied equally to all citizens. No one, including the leaders should be above the law. The human rights of citizens are protected by the laws of the country.

In democracy, it is not only the government that operates on democratic principles. Schools and other organisations are also democratic. People are elected to serve on school governing bodies and councils on committees of organisation.

But the most suitable definition is that a computer is a multipurpose electronic machine used to facilitate intellectual work and communication.

In fact, a computer is used for a wide range of services imposed by our modern society. Apart from designing, typing and printing texts, a computer can also help us to in treating and keeping data and information. It is thanks to computers that communication has become easier, faster and cheaper. When you want to entertain yourself, you just have to choose games, music, television and many others.

Nowadays, the government has realized we cannot do without computers in our development programs; therefore, computer sciences have been introduced in school curriculum. Many secondary schools and some lucky and wealthy primary schools n big cities are equipped to train young Cameroonians.

The objective is to enable as many people as possible, not only to know the various parts of a computer, but also to use it properly in their active life. However, the Government Computer Program does not go without problems: the high cost of the machines and difficulty of equipping all the schools with computers. The lack of trained personnel is also an obstacle. Most of our rural localities do not have electricity to facilitate computer installation.

Finally and paradoxically, while doctors use computers to fight against AIDS, young girls exploit them for prostitution through the internet.

Yaoundé, 16 July 2019 - First daylight breaks through the veil of haze over the metropolis. The air is still cool. The dusty, unpaved streets of Melen, a slum area in the middle of Cameroon's capital, Yaoundé, are nearly deserted at this time of the day. They use second-hand rice sacks to collect the garbage of their paying customers.

"It shouldn't end up in the ditches and clog up the drains the next time it rains," Gamel Djouelde says, as he lifts the next packed rubbish bag onto the wagon. The 21-year-old is part of a team of young men from Melen, who are earning an income from the local garbage collection project called Tam Tam Mobile. Nearly every morning at 6 a.m., Djouelde and his colleagues make their way through the community. At the end of their shift, they unload their full carts at a municipal waste collection point outside the slum.

Tam Tam Mobile is a community initiative founded in Melen. Like most informal settlements, this residential area is not connected to the city's public garbage disposal system. So the slum dwellers had to improvise. The Tam Tam Mobile initiative now has a customer base of around 300 households and is generating income for the collection team.

This initiative became one of the Community Managed Funds in the area. These are PSUP-supported action groups that take on specific tasks in the settlement. Through ERA, Tam Tam Mobile received skills training for their staff as well as work equipment such as clothes, gloves, wheelbarrows and garbage bag. PSUP assisted in widening the roads in the slum to open access and ensure Tam Mobile is connected to a collection point of the municipal waste disposal

This name later was applied to the coastal area between Mount Cameroon and Rio Muni.

Cameroon has distinct regional cultural, religious, and political traditions as well as ethnic variety. The division of the country into British- and French-ruled League of Nations mandates after World War I created Anglophone and Francophone regions. The English-speaking region consists of the Southwest and Northwest provinces, where Pidgin

English is the lingua franca and English is taught in school. The educational system and legal practices derive from those of England. The French-speaking region consists of the remaining eight regions, where French is the lingua franca, the French school system is used, and the legal system is based on the statutory law of continental Europe. This region is dominant in numbers and power. Tension between the two regions increased after the introduction of a multiparty political system in the 1990s.

The English-speaking region is divided into two cultural regions. The Grass fields people of the Northwest region consist of nearly one hundred chiefdoms each ruled by a divine king (fon). Most of these chiefdoms have patrilineal or dual descent kinship systems, although some groups, such as the Kom, are matrilineal. Polygamy and fertility are important cultural values, although this varies by wealth and education. The social organization and culture of the Grass fielders are closely related to those of the French-speaking Bamiléké people of the Western region.



PERSONAL HYGIENE

Personal hygiene is how you care for your body. This practice includes bathing, washing your hands, brushing your teeth, and more. Every day, you come into contact with millions of outside germs and viruses. They can linger on your body, and in some cases, they may make you sick. Personal hygiene practices can help you and the people around you prevent illnesses. They can also help you feel good about your appearance. Learn more about why hygiene is so important, the best ways to practice it, and how you can change your habits to make yourself feel and look better.

The second of the second Each person's idea of personal hygiene differs. These main categories are a useful place to start for building good hygiene habits. Wash your hands after you use the restroom. Scrub with soap for 20 to 30 seconds, and be sure to clean between your fingers, on the back of your hands, and under your nails. Rinse with warm water, and dry with a clean towel. If you don't have running water or soap, an alcohol-based hand sanitizer will also work. Use one that's at least 60 percent alcohol. Personal preference may dictate how often you wish to shower, but most people will benefit from a rinse at least every other day. Showering with soap helps rinse away dead skin cells, bacteria, and oils. You should also wash your hair at least twice a week. Shampooing your hair and scalp helps remove skin buildup and protects against oily residues that can irritate your skin. Trim your nails regularly to keep them short and clean. Brush under them with a nail brush or washcloth to rinse away buildup, dirt, and germs. Tidying your nails helps you prevent spreading germs into your mouth and other body openings. You should also avoid nails. Good dental hygiene is about more than just pearly white teeth! Caring for your teeth and gums is a smart way to prevent gum diseases and camities. Brush at least twice a day for 2 minutes. Aim to brush after you wake up and before bed. If you can, brush after every meal, too. Floss between your teeth daily, and ask your dentist about using an antibacterial mouthwash. These two steps can help prevent tooth decay and eliminate pockets where bacteria and germs can build up. If you're not feeling well, you should take steps to keep from spreading germs to others. This includes covering your mouth and nose when sneezing, wiping down shared surfaces with an antibacterial wipe, and not sharing any utensils or electronics. Also, immediately throw away any soiled tissues. Germs on your hands can easily enter your body through your mouth, nose, eyes, or ears. Wash your hands: 20 A W.

Three things we can recycle are **plastic bottles**, **paper**, and **glass**. For example, plastic bottles can be recycled by collecting them, cleaning them, and sending them to recycling centers where they are melted down and reused to make new products.

Topic 3: Climate Change

Climate change refers to long-term changes in temperature and weather patterns, while global warming is the rise in Earth's average temperature. Two human causes of climate change are **burning fossil fuels** and **deforestation**. A natural cause is **volcanic eruptions**, which release large amounts of CO2 into the atmosphere. Consequences of climate change include **rising sea levels** and **extreme weather events**. Possible solutions are **reducing carbon emissions** and **promoting renewable energy sources**.



Tips to become a social media influencer in Cameroon

1. Choose your niche

If you want to become a social media influencer, the first thing to do is to find a niche (a specific sector) in which you want to be known. This could be in makeup, comedy, blogging and many others. There are so many, although the most pronounced in Cameroon is comedy. Cameroonians adore entertainment. So even if you choose a different sector like make-up, make it fun. Give your audience that desire to want to spend a good time with you.

2. Choose your platform.

It is important to choose the right social platforms on which audiences with your brand interests might engage with you. Three of the most important social networks on which influencers are developing in Carnel oon is Instagram, Facebook and YouTube, with Facebook beating the other two by far. Based on aggregate data StatCounter collected on a sample of pageviews per month on social media platforms in Cameroon, it showed that facebook alone stood at 89.49% page views per month compared to Instagram (1.7%) and Youtube (1.3%). Stats of October 2019.

3. Be regular and consistent.

After you have decided what types of content you will post, you need to finalise a posting frequency and schedule. Most social media algorithms give preference to accounts that post regularly. On Facebook, Instagram and youtube, you can get away with posting only once or twice a day. But on a platform like twitter which is dynamic in nature, you need to post very often for increased visibility.
