It may sound strange but some people deliberately restrict their leisure time. They tend to spend much of their time working and take their work as a leisure time interest. Not surprisingly, these people are described as ‘workaholics’, they may work from 7 :00am to 9 :00pm six days a week so they don’t have time for anything else.

On the other hand, some people can’t wait to finish work and readily **dive** into their favourite activity be it fishing, photography, travel, football, reading etc. In fact, some people have a **great passion** for their chosen hobby and put everything into it so the work acts as a means of supporting the hobby. The types of interest you have depends upon the time available and the money you may need to spend on it. Other people try to develop perhaps two or three leisure activities **and strike a balance** between work, home and hobbies. Sometimes in choosing a hobby people tend to select what is popular at the moment. There is certainly a trend for people to follow a healthy lifestyle now by taking up more exercises. Types of keep fit have included jogging, walking, running and even marathon running.

Friends have an influence on which leisure activities we choose to do. For example, a group of friends may play in the same football or lawn tennis team. Another group may decide to go to the cinema every Sunday afternoon or just meet in town and walk round shops. Many leisure activities are geared towards groups or teams so there is a type of **peer pressure** to take part in similar leisure activities as friends.

The money that most people spend on their leisure is their disposable incomes. They use the money left over after all bills, rents, taxes have been paid. People on a low income such as the unemployed, casual workers and many pensioners have limited amount of disposable income. This restricts their leisure activities. Students too often have similar financial restrictions. The more disposable income people have, the more they can spend on relatively expensive hobbies.
