Text.

Families often experience more than friendships due to inherent closeness and intensity of familial relationships.

Unlike friends, families are connected through deep-seated bonds that encompass a mix of emotions, histories, and expectations. This can lead to higher stakes in interactions ; and less flexibility in relationships.

Additionally, the permanence of family-unlike friends who can be distanced if discord arises-means that family members are more frequently forced to confront and negotiate their differences, no matter how challenging.

Money is a big one of course ; from fighting over inheritance to disagreeing about who will pay for ageing parents or family events is top of the list when it comes to types of family conflict.

Several families are engaged in family-run business often started by a single family couple and then passed on to the couple's children, who must find ways to work together.

Resolving family conflicts effectively requires a combination of good communication, empathy, and sometimes professional intervention. The first step in preventing disputes is to establish clear and open communication where the family feels heard and valued ; this involves active listening, where each person is allowed to express his feelings without interruption or judgment.
